Entry Fees:- 25p each entry.(except children's which are free)

Entries Close:- Friday 27th July 2018

Prize Value:- First - £5.00. Second - £3.00. Third - £2.00. A Fourth Prize of £1.00. will be awarded in any class where 10 or more entries forward or stated.(except where otherwise stated)

We have also put six classes of vegetables into our schedule, as a trial, so I hope anyone interested will support them.

RULES

- 1 No exhibitor will be awarded more than one prize in any class.
- 2 Last year's prize-winning articles debarred.
- 3 Each parcel sent by post must have a list of contents and must reach the Secretary not later than 27th July 2018 and must be accompanied by the amount in postage stamps, for return postage.
- 4 Any exhibitor having 15 entries or more will be allowed a subscriber's ticket to the show field. (Entries 25p each)
- 5 All jams and lemon cheese must be shown in plain glass jam jars.
- 6 In the event of the cancellation of the show, entries of £5 or under will not be refunded.
- 7 Articles to be on stage by 10-30a.m. (Prompt)
- 8 Articles not to be claimed before 4-00p.m. on the Show Day, when prizes will be given. Articles not removed from tent by 4-30p.m. are left at the owner's risk.
- 9 The committee will not be responsible for any articles lost, although reasonable precaution will be taken.
- 10 Any complaint or protest must be made to the Secretary in writing on Show Day, accompanied by a fee of £1.00, which will be returned, should the protest be sustained.
- 11 The Judges decision is final.
